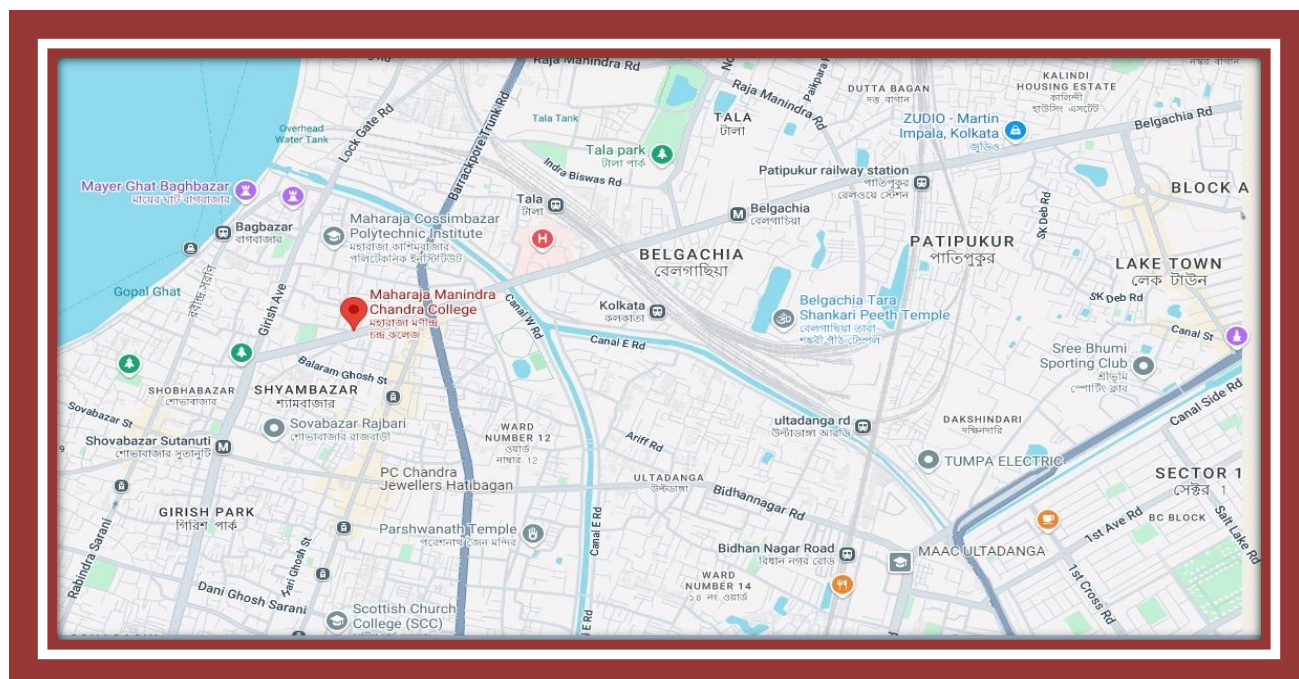

## College Location Map

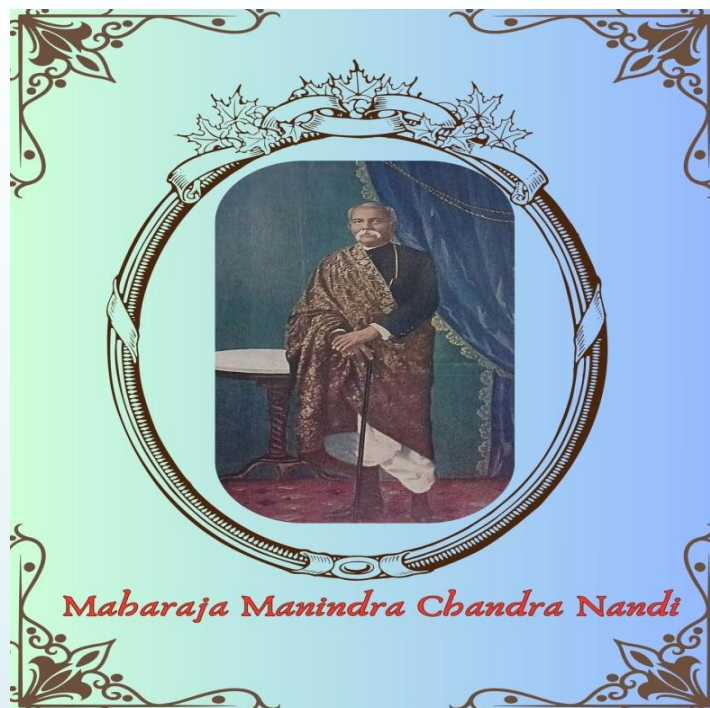

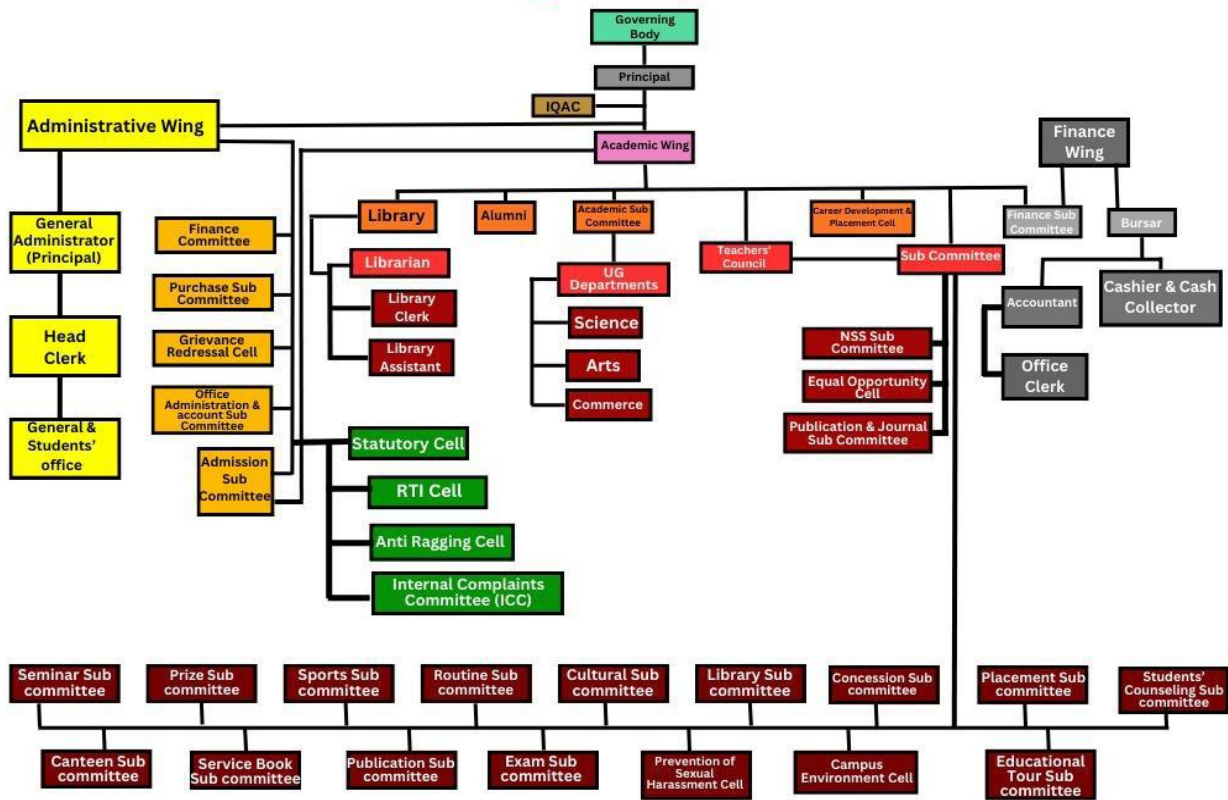
## Foundation



Maharaja Manindra Chandra College was established on the 15th of July, 1941, fulfilling a long-cherished aspiration of the residents living north of Beadon Street. The foundation of the college at 20, Ramkanto Bose Street, Kolkata–700003, was made possible through the dedicated efforts of eminent personalities, most notably the pioneering initiative of Dr. Panchanan Neogi, I.E.S. (Retd.), a distinguished educationist of the time, and the generous support of Maharaja Sris Chandra Nandi, son of the late Maharaja Manindra Chandra Nandi of Cossimbazar. The genesis of the college can be traced back to a public meeting held on December 15, 1940, at 44/A, New Shyambazar Street, where it was resolved to establish an Arts, Science, and Commerce college in memory of the Late Maharaja Manindra Chandra Nandi. Maharaja Sris Chandra Nandi graciously agreed to donate the premises for this noble purpose, leading to the foundation of the college that proudly bears his father's name. For more than eight decades, Maharaja Manindra Chandra College, under the able leadership of its dedicated Principals, has grown into one of Kolkata's premier institutions. It was accredited by NAAC in 2011 and celebrated its Platinum Jubilee in the academic session of 2015–2016.

#### *ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION -2025*

The admission process for our college is conducted through the Centralised Admission Portal, guided by the Department of Higher Education, West Bengal, and the University of Calcutta. ### **General Information and Requirement for Admission**

1. A candidate who has passed the Higher Secondary or equivalent examination (10+2 level) in or after 2022 is eligible to apply for admission to undergraduate courses.
2. A candidate must have passed English (with full marks not less than 100) in the previous qualifying examination to apply for B.A., B.Sc., or B.Com. Major and Minor courses. Eligibility criteria specific to different subjects and courses will apply as per the guidelines of the University of Calcutta.
3. Aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks of the BEST FOUR subjects (each with at least 100 marks per paper). Marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies will not be considered for calculating aggregate marks.
4. Admission will be conducted strictly on the basis of merit.
5. Only SC/ST/OBC candidates from West Bengal are eligible for reservation benefits.
6. Admission to any course at the college is provisional and subject to the final approval of the University of Calcutta.
7. An anti-ragging declaration, as mandated by the UGC, must be submitted by the student at the time of admission.
8. The college does not have hostel facilities.
9. Merit lists for all subjects, the admission schedule, and all admission notices will be published on the Centralised Admission Portal.
10. No separate communication regarding admission will be made to candidates individually.
11. Admission to semester-based B.A., B.Sc., or B.Com. (4-year Major and 3-year Minor) programs under the Curriculum and Credit Framework (CCF-2022) of the University of Calcutta will be guided by the regulations of the University of Calcutta.

## CENTRAL LIBRARY

Thomas Carlyle once said that the true university is nothing but a collection of books. The library is a place for lifelong and endless self-learning. And not only the students, but the teachers, scholars and researchers all are learners in the library. Maharaja Manindra Chandra College Central Library (MMCCCL) was started along with the establishment of the college in 1941 in order to cater the academic needs of the faculty, students and nonteaching staff of the college. The Central Library is situated on the 2nd floor of the main building of the College. The Library has a collection of nearly 40,000 books on different subjects. The Central Library also subscribes to different types of periodicals, magazines, and newspapers. Departments offering honours courses have individual seminar libraries. The Central Library has Institutional Membership with the British Council Library and the American Library.



The library collection, regularly and judiciously updated, meets the general academic purpose of the students as well as teachers and research scholars attached to this institution. Books are presently accessible through card catalogue. Apart from home borrowing, students and teachers can consult reference books and periodicals in the Library reading room. The library teachers organise from time to time, exhibitions, library initiation, and awareness programs, as well as orientation lectures, for students and also offers methodological and bibliographical counseling to teachers and researchers. Making students information-literate and knowledgeable explorers is a very important challenge in the information and knowledge-driven societies in the present digital environment. The department is working toward fulfilling that goal.



To motivate the students to maximise and properly use the library facilities and its services, the ‘Best Library User Award’ for students has been started from the academic year 2017-2018. Every year this award is conferred on the occasion of the Annual Prize-Giving Ceremony

2. Students must keep their Reference card deposited in the library while availing reading/reference services.
3. Students should be able to show their Reference Cards to prove their identity cum membership if and when asked.
4. Each student must sign the user register for students to record their attendance, purpose entry and exit time.
5. A fine of ` Rs. 1.00 per day, per book will be charged, if not returned within due time.
6. Library Cards are non -transferable. If a Library Card is lost, a duplicate card may be issued with a fine of ` Rs. 10 each.

7. Journals, Magazines, Newspapers, and Reference Books are not for lending and students are not allowed to take these documents outside the library.
8. If books are lost or damaged (including marking on the pages), the borrower must replace them with copy of the same book or the latest available edition.
9. Damaging the library property is a serious offence and is liable to punishment.
10. Students must return all books before collecting the admit card for the University Examination. It is the responsibility of every student to return all books, settle all Library dues (if any), and also get a No-dues cum Clearance Certificate from the Library.
- 11. All members associated with the institute must obtain a Clearance Certificate from the Library before being released from the institute.**
12. Chatting or sitting idly, taking refreshments, sleeping, talking on the phone, loitering aimlessly and using social media are BANNED inside the library.

### Departmental Libraries

The College Magazine is published once a year and every regular student is entitled to have a copy of the magazine. Periodical Wall Magazine is another incentive to students’ creativity.

### Extension lectures

Extension lectures on different subjects/topic by eminent scholars and renowned personalities are periodically arranged by the College. Individual Departments hold seminars (subject-specified) particularly for the students and mostly by the students of that department. “Maharaja Manindra Chandra Nandy Memorial Lecture” is held annually on November 12, the death anniversary of the Maharaja.
